## Meet A Draughts Referee

High up in the Grand Palais, in the Espace Jeanne de Flandre on the 11th floor, there are a number of spacious rooms where the draughts boards are on display. Last Friday, some checkers boards were added and also some smaller draughts boards, with only 64 squares. The main event, the World Cup Tournament finished last night, so the participants in this event are preparing themselves now for the Rapid and the Blitz tournaments that will conclude the 2nd World Mind Sports Games for them. All this is being handled very capably by the team of referees and directors up there. One of the younger members of this international company is Marieke Quant from the Netherlands. Despite her youth, she is by no means an unknown character in the international draughts world, as she has been a referee in a number of international events since 2004.

For the IMSA Bulletin Staff, it was a particularly pleasant surprise to find Marieke here, as she also is a member of the Netherlands Bridge Federation and a quite competent player of that other great mind sports game. As some of you, dear readers, will know, the IMSA Bulletin Staff mainly consists of people who are pretty closely related to the game of bridge...

It therefore looked a good idea to have a nice little chat with Marieke before putting our (in)famous questionnaire under her nose. Marieke was born on April 1st (no joke) 1979 in Apeldoorn, Netherlands, where her father was a high school teacher at the time, though he also was studying theology. She first became acquainted with draughts at the age of 12. By then, the family had moved to Hoozeveer where her father had accepted a post as a vicar. She particularly liked draughts because, as she describes it herself, "I am really fond of playing games, without ever becoming an addict."


When she was 18, she thought it was time for her to become a draughts referee. She noticed that in many clubs in the Netherlands, the referee's job was left to old people who were getting older and older. It was, in her opinion, really time for some fresh blood. Since then, she has obviously done more than well enough as she became an international referee of the FMJD almost ten years ago. Therefore, it is not really a surprise to see her at work here in Lille.

In the meantime, her family had moved over to Eindhoven where her father had accepted a new post as a vicar. Also in Eindhoven, between 2000 and 2002 she made her first steps into the world of bridge, joining a well-known local bridge club of which she still is a member. Strangely enough, she has not yet tried to become a qualified bridge tournament director or referee in the Netherlands, though this definitely is one of her ambitions, but apparently a little remote.

Apart from all these mind sports activities, she also became a student, and a brilliant one indeed.

At Tilburg University, she achieved a PhD in game theory.

For those who might not know: game theory is not about how to play your pet games but is considered a separate, advanced branch of mathematics. At present, Marieke is working as a teacher of maths and statistics at Tilburg University.
