## 1. Preamble

The Conditions of Contest herein set forth are supplemental to the General Conditions of Contest for World Bridge Championships, as issued by the World Bridge Federation and are specific for the World Teams Olympiad (OLYMPIAD), for the World Transnational Mixed Teams Championship (WTMTC), for the World Seniors International Cup (WSIC) and the World University Teams Bridge Cup (WUTBC) to be played in Maastricht, The Netherlands, from 26 August to 09 September 2000 (The Opening Ceremony is on 26 August; play starts on 27 August).
These Supplemental Conditions of Contest and the General Conditions of Contest together form the set of Rules and Regulations governing the 2000 OLYMPIAD and WTMTC, WUTC and WSIC.

## 2. Definitions

Expressions used in these Conditions of Contest and not defined shall have their ordinary meaning in the contract bridge terminology (which may include expressions defined in the Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge 1997). In the event of any doubt or dispute as to such meaning, the decision of the Tournament Rules and Regulations Committee shall be final and conclusive. The singular shall include the plural and vice-versa; reference to one gender shall include the other.

Unless repugnant to the context or obvious meaning, all terms defined in the General Conditions of Contest shall have the same meaning for the purpose of these Supplemental Conditions of Contest and, in addition, the following expressions where used in these Conditions of Contest shall have the following meanings:

### 2.1 General Conditions of Contest

mean the General Conditions of Contest issued by the World Bridge Federation for the World Bridge Championships.
2.2 Open and Closed Rooms
for any match or segment or session of a match shall be those rooms so designated by the Tournament Director.

### 2.3 Open Series

means the open tournament of the OLYMPIAD

### 2.4 Recording Form

means the form referred to in Section 18.

### 2.5 Table Result Card

means the card referred to in Section 18.
2.6 these Championships
means the OLYMPIAD and championship event means any of the events referred to in Sections 2.1, 2.10, 2.11 and 2.12.

## 2.7 these Conditions of Contest

mean the within Supplemental Conditions of Contest for the 2000 OLYMPIAD, WTMTC, WSTC and WUTC
2.8 Women's Series
means the women's tournament of the OLYMPIAD.

### 2.9 World Teams Olympiad (OL YMPIAD)

means the 2000 World Bridge Olympiad to be played in an Open Series and in a Women's Series to be conducted under the auspices of the WBF from 26 August to 09 September 2000 in Maastricht, The Netherlands or at such other time and place as the WBF determines.
2.10 World Transnational Mixed Teams Championship (WTMTC)
means a mixed teams championship to be played simultaneously with the OLYMPIAD, starting on 05 September 2000 in Maastricht, The Netherlands or at such other time and place as the WBF determines
2.11 World Senior International Cup (WSIC)
means a senior teams championship to be played simultaneously with the OLYMPIAD, starting on 27 August 2000 in Maastricht, The Netherlands or at such other time and place as the WBF determines
2.12 World Universities Teams Bridge Cup (WUTBC)
means a universities teams championship to be played simultaneously with the OLYMPIAD, starting on 27 August 2000 in Maastricht, The Netherlands or at such other time and place as the WBF determines

## 3. Conditions Of Entry

See also Section 4 of the General Conditions of Contest.
See also Section 20 for information concerning the way in which participation - or nonparticipation - in this Olympiad may affect the participation of a country in future Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup events.

### 3.1 Submission of Entries

Each NBO shall be entitled to nominate one team for the Open Series and one team for the Women's Series. The entries for the teams should be sent to the WBF President (see address below) before 1 May 2000. The submission of entries for the teams means the confirmation by the NBO that it will be participating in the Open Series, or the Women's Series, or both.
The names of the non-playing captain and the players in each team, submitted in accordance with the conditions of entry established in Section 3 of the General Conditions of Contest, should be sent, in writing, before 01 June 2000 to the WBF President (address below)

### 3.2 Entrance Fees

The prescribed entrance fees for the championships events, namely US\$ 2,500 per team, should be paid by bank transfer to the order of the WBF in the appropriate amount, for each of the Open Series and Women's Series,

If bank transfer is not possible, please contact Mrs Francin to discuss possible alternative arrangements for payment.

## $3.3 \quad$ Team Members

In addition to a non-playing captain, each team may have four, five or six members. If an NBO wishes to replace a team member, or members, or if fewer than six players were submitted for invitation, such replacement or increase (each must be from the NBO submitting the team) may be added prior to the start of the first session of play with the permission of the Credentials Committee present at the site. However, the Executive Council reserves the right, following such approval by the Credentials Committee, to place any restrictions on that team it deems proper.

### 3.4 Penalty for Non-Participation

In the event a previously entered team in these Championships determines it is unable to participate, the WBF shall be notified at least 48 hours prior to the scheduled Captains' meeting for these Championships. Failure to so notify the WBF of non-participation shall result in the imposition of a U $\$ 500$ penalty, payable by the NBO which nominated the team; an additional disciplinary penalty may be assessed if the WBF deems it appropriate. The entry fee will be refunded only if the NBO notifies the WBF prior to July 312000 that its team or teams will not participate.

## 4. Eligibility For Awards

WBF Master Points will be awarded for the OLYMPIAD, WTMTC, WUTBC and WSIC in accordance with the WBF Master Points Plan, particulars of which are set out in Appendix A

## 5. Types Of Contest - Olympiad

Teams will compete in accordance with schedules drawn up independently for the Open and Women's Series.

The schedule is drawn up in the expectation that there will be approximately 80 teams in the Open Series and 48 Teams in the Women's Series. If entries in either event are different from these numbers the WBF President may, at his discretion, make such changes to these conditions of contest as he deems appropriate, including varying the number of boards played in each series or in any phase of these Championships.

The groups were formed according to the criteria and procedures established by the WBF Management Committee and effected by an ad hoc committee nominated by the President.
In any case, the Round Robins will start on Sunday August 27. The knockout phase will begin on Sunday 03 September (Open Series) and Monday 04 September (Women's' Series).

### 5.1 Open Teams

The Open Teams are divided in four groups, and they will play a complete round robin of 20 board matches within each group, starting on Sunday August 27 and finishing on Saturday September 02. Four teams will qualify from each group and they will play knockout matches starting on Sunday 03 September. The Round of 16 will consist of 64 boards, followed by the Quarter Finals ( 80 boards), the Semi Finals ( 96 boards) and the Final ( 128 boards) finishing on Saturday 09 September.

### 5.2 Knock Out Phase - Open Teams

At the end of the round-robin the procedure outlined below will be followed:

1. There will be a draw to determine two pairs of groups (for instance $A \& C$ and $B \& D$ ).
2. In each pair of groups the first placed team of each group chooses its opponent of the round of 16 among the 2nd, 3rd and 4th qualified of the other group.
3. Of the remaining teams, the higher placed team of each group will be automatically paired with the lower ranking of the other group
4. After the matches of the round of 16 are determined, the knockout phase will continue the way described in the example that follows:

## EXAMPLE:

Assuming the draw paired groups A and C and, consequently, groups B and D :

## Round of 16:

Match 1-1st of A against 4th of C (by choice)
Match 2-1st of C against 3th of A (by choice)
Match 3-2nd of A against 3th of C (automatically)
Match 4-2nd of $C$ against 4th of A (automatically)
Match 5-1st of B against 2nd of D (by choice)
Match 6-1st of D against 4th of B (by choice)
Match 7-2nd of B against 4th of D (automatically)
Match 8-3rd of D against 3rd of B (automatically)
Quarter-finals:
Match 9 - winner of match 1 against winner of match 7
Match 10 - winner of match 2 against winner of match 8
Match 11 - winner of match 3 against winner of match 5
Match 12 - winner of match 4 against winner of match 6

## Semi-finals:

Match 13 - winner of match 9 against winner of match 11
Match 14 - winner of match 10 against winner of match 12
There will be no carry-over in any of the knockout matches.

### 5.3 Women's Teams

The Women's Teams are divided into two groups, playing a complete round robin of 20 board matches within each group Starting on Sunday August 27 and finishing on Sunday September 03. Four teams will qualify from each group, and will play knockout matches starting Monday 04 September. The Quarter finals will consist of 80 boards, followed by the Semi Finals and Finals ( 96 boards each), finishing on Friday September 08.

### 5.4 Knock out Phase - Women's Teams

To determine the quarter-final matches, the procedure is the following: the first placed team from each group freely chooses its quarter-final opponent from among the 2nd, 3rd and 4th placed teams from the other group; after the choice has been made, the second placed team (or the third, if the second was already paired), from each group, must then play the lowest ranked team in the other group not yet chosen. For the semi-finals the draw shall be made in a way that the winners of the matches involving the first placed teams from each group, do not meet and if both winners can play opponents of the other group, those matches will be played. If there is still a choice, the first ranked team will have it; otherwise, there will be a draw to establish the matches. The winners of the semi-finals play the final and the losers will playoff for the third place.

There will be no carry-over in any of the knockout matches.

### 5.5 Sequence of Play in both series

The sequence of play in the Round Robins will be in accordance with the tables contained in Appendix D - General Schedules of Play which allow for either 20, 22 or 24 teams in the groups. For a different number of teams the same pattern will be followed. For these schedules the first named team will play North South in the Open Room.

### 5.6 Seating Rights in Round Robin (both Series)

During the Round Robin the first mentioned team in the schedule of play will be the home team and will sit N/S in the Open Room and E/W in the Closed Room. The second named team is the visiting team and sits E/W in the Open Room and N/S in the Closed Room. (See the regulations for line-up on section 11). If the round-robin match is played in two sessions, the first mentioned team is the Home Team in the first session and the Visiting Team in the second.
Full Details regarding Line Ups and Seating rights are contained in Sections 11 and 12

### 5.7 Special regulations for the Semi-Finals (both series)

In the semi finals, if two teams from the same national flag are classified, they will play each other, independently of any previously specified draw.

### 5.8 Authority of the Rules and Regulations Committee

The Tournament Rules and Regulations Committee has the authority to make some changes in the groups (and, as a consequence, in the sequence of play) if required by occurrences after the seeding has been announced.

## 6. World Transnational Mixed Teams Championship (WTMTC)

### 6.1 Mixed Team Definition

A mixed team consists of 4,5 or 6 players, Partnerships must comprise one player of each sex at all times.

### 6.2 Conditions of Entry

All players participating in the WTMTC must be approved by the NBO of origin and submitted to the WBF Credentials Committee. The entry fee will be US $\$ 800$, but if a team is composed of players eliminated from the Olympiad together with players who have not competed in the Olympiad, the players who have not competed will be charged US $\$ 150$ if it is a team of six, or $\$ 200$ if it is a team of four. A team consisting entirely of players eliminated from the Olympiad will be permitted to play free of charge. The teams must be registered and the players' names must be submitted to the WBF before 15 July 2000. The WBF will accept entries for Mixed Teams of which the majority of members are from teams not qualified for the knockout phase of the Olympiad and, in this case, the entry fee can be paid on site. The deadline for registration will be announced in the Olympiad Daily Bulletin and the teams are required to indicate, as soon as possible, that they will be participating in the WTMTC if eliminated from the Olympiad.

### 6.3 Type of Contest

The format will depend on the final number of entries, but is likely to be Swiss type, but with semi-finals and a final being played in order to determine the Gold, Silver and Bronze medallists. The Bronze Medal will be awarded to the losing semi-finalist higher placed in the Swiss ranking.

The semi finals will be played in accordance with the schedule of play in the Open Series Final (see Section 10.2). After the qualification, two more rounds of the Swiss will be played in order to determine the classification from the 5th place on.
The winner of the Swiss will have a choice of opponents for the semi-finals from amongst the third and fourth ranked teams.

If, with one or more matches still to play, a team is in a position that it has already secured a qualifying position from the Swiss into the knock-out phase and can never improve on that position, then that team shall take no further part in the Swiss phase of the event

### 6.4 Systems

The WTMTC is deemed to be a Category 3 event throughout.

### 6.5 Tie-breaking

In case of ties, the tie-breaking procedures for the OLYMPIAD will apply with the following differences: In the Swiss, in order to determine a position at any time, the first two criteria (a) and (b) are reversed, (b) becoming (a) and vice-versa (see points 15.1, 15.2 and 15.3 for the tie-breaking procedures). In the Semi-finals and final, there will be 4 additional boards instead of 8 and only one series of 4 boards will be played (see 15.4) after which sudden death boards will be played

### 6.6 Drop-in Rules

All Teams are expected to play from the very first match of the Swiss.
Should a problem arise that prevents the defeated quarter-finalists from joining the Swiss at Match 1, the Tournament Rules and Regulations Committee will decide the drop-in method.

## 7. World Seniors International Cup (WSIC)

### 7.1 Conditions of Entry

Each NBO shall be entitled to nominate one team for the WSIC. All members of the team must be citizens or bona fide residents of the NBO they are representing. See Section 4 of the General Conditions of Contest .

The entries for the teams should be sent to the WBF President (See Section 3.1 for address details etc.) no later than 01 May 2000. Names of the players must be submitted by 01 June 2000.

### 7.2 Systems

This event is deemed to be a Category 3 event throughout.

### 7.3 Entry Fee

The entry fee will for the Seniors International Cup will be US $\$ 1,400$. See Section 3.2 for details of how payments should be made.

### 7.4 Type of Contest

This Championship will consist of a Round Robin of 12-board matches, with the final ranking determining the medal positions.

### 7.5 Tie-breaking

In case of ties, the tie-breaking procedures for the OLYMPIAD will apply.

## 8. World University Bridge Teams Cup (WUBTC)

The World University Bridge Teams Cup will be played under the auspices of FISU (Fédération Internationales des Sports Universitaires).

### 8.1 Conditions of Entry

Each NBO shall be entitled to nominate one team for the WSIC.
All members of the team must be students at University within the NBO nominating them.

### 8.1.1 Age Limit

The minimum age for players in the event is 17 , the maximum age is 28 .

### 8.1.2 Dates for Submission of Entries

The entries for the teams should be sent to the WBF President (See Section 3.1 for address details etc.) no later than 01 May 2000. Names of the players must be submitted by 01 June 2000.

### 8.2 Entry Fee

There is no entry fee for the WUTBC

### 8.3 Type of Contest

This Championship will consist of a complete Round Robin of 12 board matches, with the final ranking determining the medal positions.

### 8.4 Systems

This event is deemed to be a Category 3 event throughout.

## $8.5 \quad$ Tie-breaking

In case of ties, the tie-breaking procedures for the OLYMPIAD will apply.

## 9. Conversion Scales

The difference in IMPs earned by the two opposing teams at the end of the matches scored in IMPs shall be converted to Victory Points, according to the official WBF conversion scales. (see Appendix 5 of the General Conditions of Contest)

### 10.8 Captains' Meetings

There will be captains' meetings at the end of the round of 16 , the quarter-finals and semifinals, as soon as possible after the scheduled time for the end of the matches; exact time and place will be announced by the Tournament Director.

* Times scheduled for the WTMTC are indicative; official times will be announced in the Olympiad Daily Bulletin.
The Rules and Regulations Committee reserves the right to alter the schedule in any way should circumstances require this to be done.


## 11. Line-Ups

The line-ups during the round robin must for both teams be submitted no later than 15 minutes after the end of the previous round; teams will not know the line-up of their opponents. The lineup for the first round must be given in accordance with the decision taken in the Captains Meeting.

In the K.O. phase the team to line-up first must submit its line-up no later than 15 minutes after the end of the previous session. The second team must then submit its line-up no later than 20 minutes after the end of the previous session or no later than 5 minutes after the submission of the first line-up, whichever is latest.
Line-ups are to be submitted at the place designated by the Operations Director

## 12. Seating Rights

### 12.1.1 The Knock Out Phase

In the knock out phase, in each match, each series of 16 boards constitutes a session; two sessions constitute a portion.. If there are an odd number of sessions, each session constitutes a portion.
If the portions are divided into 2 sessions, the teams in turn, by draw, select a portion and decide in which of the two sessions they want to line-up after their opponents. In the other session they will line up first. There shall be a coin toss to decide which team has first choice to select a portion.
In the matches which one portion is equal to one session, the teams in turn, by draw, select a session and decide if they want to line-up before or after their opponents. There shall be a coin toss to decide which team has first choice to select a portion.

In the portion of its choice, a team sits N/S in the Open Room (and is considered to be the Home Team) and E/W in the Closed Room
If there is an odd number of portions, the winner of the coin toss has the right of choice for the majority of the portions.

### 12.2 Seating rights for Tie-breaks in the knockout phase

If there is a tie at the end of the quarter-finals, semi-finals, or the finals, requiring that an extra session of boards be played, there shall be a draw by the captains to determine the "Home Team". If, after the first series of additional boards, a tie still exists, the "Visiting Team" during the first extra eight boards shall be the "Home Team" for the next eight boards. to determine which team has to line-up after its opponent. That team sits N/S in the Open Room. If after 8 boards, a tie still exists for the second set of extra boards, these rights go to the other team. Line-up changes may be made before play begins for either the first or second (if needed) group of eight tie-break boards. In each case, the captain of the "Visiting Team" team lining up first shall submit its line-up at a time to be determined by the Tournament Director, the "Home Team" the other team captain within five minutes thereafter. Each group of eight "extra" boards shall be considered as a separate session. At the discretion of the captain of the "Home Team" for the second group of eight boards, a pair or pairs may play against a pair or pairs it played against during the first eight extra boards. If a tie still exists, requiring that single board "sudden death" matches be played, the line-ups and seating positions for both teams will be the same as for the second eight boards of the tie-break.

### 12.3 Change of Players

A change of players, pairs or partnerships can be made only at the beginning of a match or a session (but see exception in Section 15 when extra tie-break boards are played.)

## 13. Disclosure Of Systems And Conventions

### 13.1 WBF Systems Policy 2000

The WBF Systems Policy (See General Conditions of Contest, Appendix 2) forms part of these Conditions of Contest. The OLYMPIAD is considered a Category 3 event in its qualifying stages (round-robin) and a Category 2 event in the knockout phase (including the play-offs). The WTMTC is considered a Category 3 event. In Category 2 events only (i.e. during the knock-out phase of the Open and Ladies Championships), Brown Sticker conventions will be permitted. HUM Systems are not permitted at any time (but see the WBF Systems Policy). The WSIC the WUBTC are designated Category 3 events.

### 13.2 Submission of Systems for the Olympiad

Each team captain is responsible for sending the convention cards by email or on a $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{PC}$ diskette to:

as soon as possible, but in any event before July 1, 2000, for every partnership that will play in these Championships, their Systems described on the official WBF Convention Card, completed in accordance with the Guide to Completion, using the Convention Card Editor (CCE), which is available to all NBOs, , plus Supplementary Sheets, as necessary to describe conventional sequences in detail. Penalties for failure to submit Convention Cards and Supplementary in time are (in addition to Section 13.3.1) specified in Section 17.

The Convention Cards may be prepared using any of the following programs - the WBF Convention Card Editor (Windows Version), which is available for free download from www.bridge.gr or http://bridge.ecats.co.uk, the Convention Card Editor written by Lee Edwards, available for download from www.acbl.org, the DOS Convention Card Editor provided free of charge by the WBF, Microsoft Word, Microsoft Excel or PageMaker for the PC. Where possible (and particularly in the case of those using programs other than the official WBF Windows Convention Card Editor and the DOS Convention Card Editor) these cards will be converted, by the Systems Administrator to PDF files which can be read and printed using Acrobat Reader which is available as a free download from www.adobe.com.
Following registration of the systems for all pairs in a team, the systems will be displayed on a web site designed for the purpose, and the URL (Internet address) will be sent by email to the captain of the team making the registration and, if email addresses are provided for the team members, also to them individually. These email addresses will also be displayed on the page so that other captains who may have queries about specific systems can contact the team concerned. All such contacts should be copied, by email, to the WBF Systems Administrator (systems@ecats.co.uk).

Following the event, the WBF reserves the right to display the Convention Cards and Supplementary Sheets (but not the email addresses) in a public area for interested parties to see them. If a full system is submitted, this will not be included on such pages of the site.

### 13.3 Special Regulations Relating to Brown Sticker Conventions

Pairs intending to use Brown Sticker Conventions for the knock-out should list these, together with the subsequent bidding sequences in a separate text document (Word, WordPerfect, MSWorks, WordPad or similar PC document), with a note referring to them in the Section "Special Bids that May Require Defence" on the front of the card. This text document must be clearly marked with the players names, country and the event in which they are competing (i.e. Open or Ladies Teams). Brown Sticker Conventions may NOT be played in the Round Robin

### 13.3.1 Penalties for non-submission of Systems

Any partnership whose duly completed original Card and Supplementary Sheets have not reached Anna Gudge in accordance with these Conditions of Contest, shall (in addition to the penalties referred to in Section 17.1) be required by the Tournament Appeals Committee (unless it rules otherwise) to use the system described on the World Standard Card for not less than the first two days.

### 13.3.2 Distribution of Systems

The WBF deems the publication of the URL of the private web site to the Captains of all teams submitting systems in accordance with the regulation detailed above to constitute distribution of systems. All teams should make every effort to download and print sufficient copies of their opponent's systems for their own use. Should there be any changes to systems uploaded, the WBF Systems Administrator will email details to all captains / players on the email list so that they are aware of them as soon as possible. No changes will be made to any systems on the web site after 31 July 2000 except in cases of emergency, in which event full notification will be sent to all other captains. Prior to this date, the date of update will be displayed prominently on the site, and details given of any newly uploaded version.

### 13.4 Supplementary Sheets

Where a conventional sequence cannot be described adequately in the space provided on the WBF Convention Card, a reference number should be placed prominently at the appropriate place on the Card; a Supplementary Sheet bearing that reference number, and containing the complete explanation, must be submitted along with the Card.

### 13.5 Systems for the WTMTC

Convention Cards and Supplementary Sheets, completed in accordance with Sections 13.1 and 13.4 above will be required for each player in the WTMTC. These Cards need not be registered in advance, but all players will be required to have two copies of their Card available for the opposition at all times. This Championship is Category 3 in accordance with the WBF Systems Policy 2000

### 13.6 Changes to Cards/Supplementary Sheets

(a) Any changes to the duly submitted (as per Section 13.2) Card and/or Supplementary Sheets must be submitted in official form (see (b) below) to Mrs. Anna Gudge (systems@ecats.co.uk) as early as possible for everyone's benefit, but in any event no later than 31 July 2000. These changes (which may be clarifications, amendments, minor additions, and/or cosmetic revisions) will be uploaded to the web site as soon as possible.
(b) Official Form for changes:
(i) A new page of the Convention Card/Supplementary Sheet that reflects proposed change.

[^0](ii) A text document, also to be sent by email, detailing the changes that have been made and referring to the area on the Convention Card /Supplementary Sheet where such changes can be found.
(c) After 31 July 2000 no further changes will be made to the web site without all teams being informed by email, and then only in emergency (for example if a pair is obliged to withdraw and the substitute pair needs to register a different card).
(d) In order for a change to be implemented on site, it must be duly approved, signed, and dated by the Chairman of the Systems Committee or his designee, and then circulated to all relevant teams in timely fashion. Such circulation may be done by manual distribution on site at the Captains' Meeting, or through Captain's mailboxes on site. The Chairman of the Systems Committee will apply the WBF Systems Policy 2000 (See Appendix 2 of the General Conditions of Contest) when considering applications to make system changes.
(e) Approval for a change may be given or refused in whole or part by the Chairman of the Systems Committee or his designee and may be given subject to conditions. One such condition will usually be that any such change cannot be implemented for a certain number of matches or in the course of a particular stage of the event, with possible prejudice to unprepared opponents being a particularly important negative factor. Clarifications and improvements to presentation will not be considered in the same way as substantive changes.

### 13.7 Special Responsibility for BROWN STICKER CONVENTIONS

With regard to BROWN STICKER systems/conventions, there is a special responsibility for users to explain their methods in sufficient detail (as per the Guide to Completion and the CCE), the first time that Cards are submitted. Brown Sticker Conventions must be presented on a separate text document, not on the main card, with a note in the section "Bids which may require Special Defence". This text document must be clearly marked with the players names, country and the event in which they are competing (i.e. Open or Ladies Teams) These conventions may NOT be used at any stage during the Round Robin. If these submissions are inadequate, the pair may be barred from using those badly or inadequately described methods for the entire tournament and certainly for at least one half of the knockout match. These penalties are quite severe, but with the duly executed distribution of these Conditions and all significant materials by the WBF, no pair will be permitted to claim ignorance of this special responsibility. The NBO, the Captains and the players are jointly responsible for contacting the WBF should there be any problems in obtaining the necessary tournament information in timely fashion.
If these materials are received prejudicially late, it is the responsibility of the jointly responsible parties to so inform the WBF as soon as possible.

### 13.8 Defences to Brown Sticker Conventions

(a) A pair may prepare written defences against the Brown Stickers elements of any system (see the WBF System Policy, attached). These defences are deemed to be part of the opponents' Systems

Teams judged guilty of slow play will be subject to penalty (see Section 17). Additional time will not be allowed for teams playing on Vu-Graph; neither will extra time be granted because of the
use of bidding boxes, screens, discussions of systems or for other similar reasons. Vu-Graph presentation for any match or session, will not start until the Tournament Director notifies the Chief Commentator or his designee.
For shorter or longer matches the allowed time will be based on approximately 8 minutes and 45 seconds per board.

## 15. Tie-Breaking Procedures

### 15.1 Two Teams

If two teams are tied with the same number of Victory Points at the end of the round-robin, the tie shall be broken as follows (in the sequence shown):
(a) IMP quotient (total IMPs won divided by total IMPs lost) in all matches played by the tied teams in that particular event. If the tie remains, then
(b) IMPs earned by the tied teams in the match they played against each other. If the tie remains, then:
(c) Total points earned by the tied teams in the match they played against each other. If the tie remains, then:
(d) Total point quotient in all matches played by the tied team in that particular event. If the tie remains, then:
(e) One board ("sudden death") matches will determine the winner.

### 15.2 Three Teams

If three teams are tied with the same number of Victory Points at the end of the round-robin, the tie shall be broken according to the following:
(a) IMP quotient in all matches played by the tied teams in that particular event. If one tie still remains it shall be broken in accordance to Section 15.1. If the three teams remain tied, then:
(b) If one of the teams earned more VPs against each of the other two in the matches it played against them in that particular event, it shall be declared winner and, if necessary, the tie between the remaining two teams shall be broken in accordance with Section 15.1. If the three teams remain tied, then:
(c) If one of the teams earned more VPs against one of the remaining teams and tied with the other in the matches it played between them in that particular event, it shall be declared winner and the tie between the remaining teams shall be broken, if necessary, in accordance with Section 15.1
(d) In all other cases, ties shall be broken in accordance with the following:
(i) Highest net total IMPs earned by the tied teams in the matches they played against each other. If one tie still remains it may be broken in accordance with Section 15.1. If the three teams remain tied, then:
(ii) Highest net total points earned by the tied teams in matches they played against each other. If one tie still remains it may be broken in accordance with Section 15.1. If the three teams remain tied, then:
(iii) Total points quotient earned in all matches played by the tied teams. If one tie still remains it may be broken in accordance with Section 15.1. If the three teams remain tied, then:
(iv) One-board ("sudden death") matches will determine the winner.

### 15.3 Four Teams

If four or more teams are tied with the same number of Victory Points at the end of the roundrobin, the tie shall be broken according to the following:
(a) IMP quotient in all matches played by the tied teams in that particular event, shall govern. Any ties remaining will be broken in accordance with Section 15.1. and 15.2 if appropriate. If there are more than three teams that remain tied after use of IMP quotients, then:
(b) If one of the teams earned more VPs against each of the remaining tied teams in that particular event or if it has, uniquely, tied one and defeated the other tied teams, it shall be declared winner and the ties for the remaining teams will be broken in accordance with Section 15.2, if appropriate. If there are more than three teams that remain tied, then:
(c) Total points quotient in all matches played by the tied teams in that particular event, shall govern. Any ties remaining will be broken in accordance with Sections 15.1. or 15.2 if appropriate. If there are more than three teams that remain tied after the application of total points quotient, then:
(d) One-board ("sudden death") matches will determine the winner.

### 15.4 Knockout Phase

In the round of 16, quarter-finals, semi-finals, and finals, if a tie exists at the end of the match, it will be resolved by playing eight additional boards. (See Section 11 for the procedure used to determine whether teams play N/S or E/W in the Open and Closed Rooms). Should a tie still exist, eight more boards will be played. If a tie still exists, one-board ("sudden death") matches will determine the winner.

## 16. Disqualification

In the case of a team being disqualified, all matches it played prior to its disqualification may in the discretion of the Tournament Appeals Committee, usually depending on the validity of the matches, be declared void and the scores earned by its opponents in those matches may be cancelled or varied.

## 17. Penalties

The schedule of penalties which follows is supplemental to the Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge 1997. All infringements of the Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge 1997 will be dealt with in accordance with the Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge 1997. Monetary fines shall be paid in U.S. Dollars, or the equivalent in local currency. Monies assessed shall be turned over to the Tournament Director for transmittal to the Chairman of the Tournament Appeals Committee. Upon publication of these Conditions of Contest no further warning is required (whether from the Director or otherwise) prior to the application of any penalty under the provision of the Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge 1997 or of these Conditions of Contest. Victory Point penalties, where applicable, shall be deducted from the score of the offending team at the conclusion of the Round-Robin. The VP penalties shall not affect individual matches for purposes of tiebreaking procedures in any manner, but may determine a team's ranking. Penalties assessed in IMPs shall be deducted from the score of the offending team at the conclusion of the match during (i.e. in regard to) which the penalty was imposed, before its VP score is calculated. However, the score of the non offending team shall not be affected, except in the knockout phase.

### 17.1 Failure to File Systems in a Timely Fashion

Any team containing a partnership that, through the agency of its captain, or otherwise, has failed to comply with the time requirements of Section 13.2 shall (in addition to the requirements of Section 13.3.1):
(a) be subject to a decision of the Tournament Appeals Committee which may forbid the team to use specific conventional understandings not submitted in accordance with these Conditions of Contest. If a disallowed convention is used, the Tournament Appeals Committee may impose penalties at its discretion; and
(b) be fined US $\$ 100$ to be paid prior to the commencement of the Tournament.

### 17.2 Failure to Submit Line-up on Time

If a Captain fails to submit line-ups in accordance with Section 11:
(a) for the first such offence a warning shall be issued by the Tournament Director;
(b) for the second offence there shall be a fine of US\$ 20;
(c) for the third offence there shall be a fine of US\$ 40 and for each subsequent offence there shall be a fine of US\$ 50 ;
(d) penalties are cumulative.

When failure to provide the line-up in a timely fashion is due to late filing by the captain of the opposing team, penalties under this Section shall be imposed only on the captain of the team whose duty it was to file line-up first. The captain of the other team shall have five minutes after the filing of the offending team's line-up to file his own. If, after filing of the line-up by the offending team, the captain of the non-offending team exceeds the filing deadline, or the extra five minutes allocated in the foregoing, whichever is later, this captain too is deemed guilty of late line-up filing and is subject to penalty under this Section.

### 17.3 Lateness

Any team not seated and ready to play at the announced starting time of a match or a session of a match will be assessed a penalty according to the following scale:

### 17.3.1 During the Round-Robin

### 17.3.2 During the Knock-out Phase

$0+-\quad 5$ minutes late $\quad$ warning to captain(s) (after the second warning the provision for 5+ minutes late shall apply)
5+ - 25 minutes late 1 IMP plus an additional 1 IMP for each full minute or part thereof beyond 5 minutes.

Over 25 minutes late at the discretion of the Tournament Appeals Committee; may include recommendation of forfeit of match or more severe action by the Executive Council.

### 17.4 Slow Play

The time allowed for each match or session shall be computed from the time play in such match or session is started by a Tournament Director. If play continues after the time allowed by Section 14 of these Conditions then either or both of the pairs shall be subject to penalty, according to the amount of delay for which such pair was judged responsible, as follows:

### 17.4.2 Excess time apportioned to a pair during the Round-Robin

Example: If a 16-board match or session took 2 hours and 35 minutes (excess of 15 minutes) and pair $A$ is held responsible for 9 extra minutes and pair $B$ for 6 extra minutes total penalty will be 2 VPs ; pair A receiving 1.2 VPs penalty and pair B 0.8 VP penalty. In any case, if the Tournament Director judges that one match will be so delayed that it would disturb the starting time of the next round, he may truncate it, reducing the number of the boards played: if this happens, the match will be scored only with the boards played at both tables, but the same conversion scale will be used as that used for the complete matches.

### 17.4.3 Excess time apportioned to a pair during the Quarter-finals, Semifinals and Finals

0+ - 25 minutes late 1 IMP for each minute or part thereof
Over $\quad 25$ minutes late at the Discretion of the Tournament Appeals Committee; may include recommendation of forfeit of match or more severe action by the Executive Council.

A Tournament Director or an official appointed by the President shall determine responsibility for slow play. A partnership which considers its opponents are playing slowly shall inform the Tournament Director who may appoint a monitor if he thinks it is necessary; the partnership is only protected from the time at which the Tournament Director is informed. A Director may install a monitor without being requested to by the players.

### 17.5 Fouled Boards

See Section 16.1 of the General Conditions of Contest for explanation. If a board is fouled and it can be determined that one side is clearly at fault, that side shall be subject to procedural penalty.

### 17.6 Appeals without merit

Teams will forfeit the deposit of US\$ 50 if the Tournament Appeals Committee determines the appeal was without merit. See Section 27 of the General Conditions of Contest.

## 18. Recording Of Matches And Verification Of Scores

### 18.1 Official Table Result Card

An official Table Result Card must be filled in by the North or South player at each table, for each match and sessions thereof. Team captains will determine and agree upon the scores for each match and segments thereof. At the conclusion of each match, or session of a match the Tournament Director shall post an official result. The correction period in Law 79C expires at the time specified in Section 27 of the General Conditions of Contest; and thereafter, the results will be final, with the following exceptions:
(i) awaiting decision of the Tournament Appeals Committee on a filed appeal;
(ii) completion of play or replay boards where such replay has been directed by the Tournament Appeals Committee.

### 18.2 Table Recorders

During the play of each hand of the round-robin and quarter-final matches, when there is not an official record (as in Vu-Graph matches for instance), an Approved Recorder (see General Conditions, Section 20) shall record the bidding, the lead for the first three tricks, and the result, on the Recording Form provided at the table. The Team playing North/South is responsible for the provision of such Recorders. Additional recording might be requested.

### 18.3 Score Corrections

Score corrections may be made as sanctioned in Law 79 and in Laws 69 and 71.
An agreed-upon score that is proven to be erroneous to the complete satisfaction of the Chief Tournament Director and the Appeals Committee, may be corrected provided that any such score has been brought to the attention of the Chief Tournament Director no later than 30 minutes after the end of play in any phase of the event except that an extension of an additional 30 minutes will be permitted following the last segment of play at the end of the day. However, no changes to segments prior to the last segment will be permitted at that time.

## 19. Appendix A - Eligibility For Awards

According to the WBF Master Points Plan, the following scale of Master Points will be awarded to the Championship events.

Additionally, in both Series, in the round-robin, 6 or 3 master points will be awarded to the team for each match won or tied (VPs 15-15), respectively.

### 19.1 Special Conditions

In order to qualify for the MPs and PPs won by the team, a player, in any case, must have played at least one third of the hands played by his team in the round-robin.

## In addition:

(a) For first place: open teams - at least 128 (if there is the round of 16) or 112 hands (if the KO phase starts in the quarter-final) of the total number of hands in the knockout phase, and at least 48 hands of the final; women's teams - at least 96 hands of the total number of hands played in the knockout phase and at least 32 hands of the final.
(b) For second place: open teams - at least 64 hands of the total number of hands in the round of 16, quarter-final and semi-final combined or at least 48 hands of the total number of hands in the quarter-final and semi-final combined (if there is not the round of 16) and at least 32 hands of the total number of hands of the semi-final; women's teams - at least 48 hands of the total number of hands in the quarter-final and semifinal combined and at least 32 hands of the semi-final.
(c) For third place: at least 48 of the total number of hands played in the round of 16 and in the quarter-final or at least 32 boards played in the quarter-final (if there is not round of 16 ) and at least 16 boards in the quarter-final.
(d) For fourth place: at least 32 hands of the total number of hands in the round of 16 and quarter-final combined and at least 16 hands of the total number of hands in the quarter-final if there is not the round of 16.
(e) For fifth to eighth place: at least 16 boards of the round of 16 if there is such round. . The fifth through eighth place will be decided among the losers of the quarter-finals according to the positions of the teams in the round-robin (better percentage of VP won); if there is a tie, the Master Points for the tied positions will be divided among the tied teams.
The ninth through the sixteenth places will be decided among the losers of the round of 16 (if there is such round) according to the to the positions of the teams in the round-robin (better percentage of VP won); if there is a tie, the Master Points for the tied positions will be divided among the tied teams.

In order to qualify for the title of World Champion, the conditions are the same as those needed to qualify for the Master Points of first place.
The World Transnational Mixed Teams Championships will award Master Points in accordance with the following scale:

## 20. Appendix B - Format For Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup After 1995

1. Participation will include at least one (1) NBO team from each functioning WBF Zone plus one (1) NBO team from the host country.
2. A Zone whose NBO registered membership is fewer than 100,000 can send one (1) team, but see 8. below.
3. A Zone whose NBO registered membership is between 100,000 and 250,000 can send two (2) teams, but see 8. and 9. below.
4. A Zone whose NBO registered membership is in excess of 250,000 can send three (3) teams, but see 8. below.
5. A Zone may send only one (1) team from an individual NBO, except that up to two (2) teams may be sent from an NBO whose membership exceeds 150,000.
6. A Zone may only send teams comprised wholly of members of an individual NBO.
7. A Zone may only send teams from NBOs which participated in the immediately previous World Teams Olympiad. In order to participate in the Bermuda Bowl, the NBO in question must have participated in the Open Teams Olympiad; to participate in the Venice Cup, the NBO must have had a team participating in the Women's Teams Olympiad
8. In addition to the number of teams set forth in 2, 3 and 4 above, a Zone may send one (1) more team if that Zone has placed at least the number of teams to be sent in the top $1 / 2$ of their respective round-robins in the immediately previous World Team Olympiad. [Example: A Zone falling in 2. above would have to place at least two (2) teams in the top $1 / 2$ of the Bermuda Bowl round-robin of the immediately previous World Team Olympiad in order to send two (2) teams to the Bermuda Bowl.]
9. In the case of Zone 2, 3. above notwithstanding, the following rules shall apply:
(a) ACBL can send one team from either Canada, Mexico or Bermuda provided that at least one of these three NBOs has placed in the top one-half of their Round Robin in the immediately previous World Olympiad and the NBO that is sent participated in the previous World Olympiad; and
(b) ACBL can send one team from the USA provided that USA participated in the immediately previous World Olympiad. Additionally, ACBL can send a second team from the USA provided USA finished in the top one-half of its Round Robin in the previous World Olympiad and USA's membership remains above 150.000.
(c) 10. If, based on the above regulations, this will result in an odd number of teams participating in either Championship, one additional Zone 1 team will be invited to participate.
