Meet The Chess Directors

Somewhere on the 9th floor, you will find a few rooms where the chess boards are on display. These have been in use for most part of the week to serve as the basic instruction material for the very young players who have been around here. From yesterday onwards, however, a few more tournaments are also being played in this part of the Grand Palais.

Both the instruction sessions and the tournaments here are run by two people from Belgium, Mathieu Janssens and Eleuthère Moreau, who work as chess teachers at schools in the region of Lille.

Mathieu was born on February 6, 1984, in Mouscron, a city just over the Belgian border here that belongs to the province of Hainaut. He now lives in Wervik, also very close to Lille but belonging to the Dutch-speaking part of Belgium (province of West-Flanders).

At the age of six, he started playing draughts. A very old man, well over 80, who lived in his street in Mouscron, taught him the game and added: "As soon as you beat me,

I will teach you how to play with the big pieces." Though Mathieu managed to beat him at a rate of once in 100 games, the old man passed away before he could start to give the young kid any chess lessons. When Mathieu was 12, he found a book called: "How to learn chess." He immediately devoured this book, so shortly afterwards he felt it was time to visit a chess club. This proved a good move as he won the Junior Championship of the club within a year. In 2001, he became Belgian national champion of the players with an Elo rating of less than 1500.

Eleuthère was born on August 31, 1973, in Mons, the capital of the Belgian province of Hainaut. At present, he lives in Mathieu's birth-place, Mouscron. Apart from his work as a chess teacher, he also runs a maintenance company in Tourcoing, a town in the Lille region. For him too, the first mind sport to learn was draughts. He played it quite a lot in the late eighties. In 1990, however, he met a friend who owned an electronic chess game. He had a look at it, got enthusiastic about it, asked his friend if he could borrow it, got it and never gave it back...

He joined the chess club in Mons in 1996, only to find that there were far too many veterans among the members. For that reason, he decided to start his own chess club in the same year, a club that would mainly concentrate on young people, coming from student circles in Mons and Charleroi.

Between 2000 and 2007, he did not pay much attention to chess but in 2007, after moving to Mouscron, he founded yet another new chess club there, of which he still is the president. Over now to our questionnaires.

Gaming; they are often people who like to play any kind of games.

What is it you dislike in a person?

Insincerity.

Do you have any superstitions concerning chess?

No.

Which three people would you invite to dinner?

My grandmother, my niece and Nelson Mandela.

ZIMMERMANN FROM Z TO A

Pierre is 57. He has been married to Christine for 17 years, they have two children – a boy and a girl - who are on very good terms with Pierre's three children from a previous marriage. He plays bridge with French star Franck Multon for Monaco and holds two passports, Swiss and French. He lives partly in Geneva and is general manager of a successful real estate company, la régie Zimmermann.

We met him between two (winning) matches for Monaco.

Daily Bulletin

We met you last year as you were nominated Bridge Personality of the Year; here you are, having just won the European title in Dublin and in a team that is favorite to win the world title next week: Where will you stop?

Pierre Zimmermann

I would gladly answer "no limit," but here in Lille I think four countries are favored: USA, Italy, Netherlands and Monaco with Germany, Russia and Poland as outsiders.

DB

Successful in your family life, in your professional career, and now in bridge, is there a Zimmermann method?

PZ

The motto of my company is *Travail et tempérance sont les meilleurs docteurs de l'homme** – Jean Jacques Rousseau. It is true for every field, I admit errors from my collaborators and from my bridge teammates. I like action but criticism is not allowed if success is not here. What I like is that all members of our team are friends and accept accidents from the others without a word, knowing the balance will be positive. *Translation: "Work and moderation are the best doctors for men."

DB

The late Antoine Bernheim used to say that he preferred to win a bridge tournament than to have a winning deal in business. Do you agree?

PZ

Real estate business is made of many small deals and losing one is not so important, so I support fully this idea.

DB

A lot has been written about the creation of the new Monaco team. Please express your opinion on the subject.

PZ

The "project Monaco" came to life with the important support of Jean-Charles Allavena and the eagerness of Fantoni and Nunes to get to an happy end. They were heavily criticized by some Italian players and Mrs Lavazza, who thought their ranking of first and second in the world was pure luck. They wanted to prove the contrary, and knew they had no international future in Italy. Winning is very important for them – and also for me. For playing, they get moderate fees but large bonus for results. That is my policy in bridge and business.

Monaco's team is the weapon of revenge for the two Italian champions.

DB

You are member of French Federation, by playing for Monaco with Franck Multon, probably the best French player, are you aware that you have weakened the French team ?

PZ

The Monaco team is not a final goal for me. I invest a lot in Monaco and organizing bridge in the principality and, with my support, the Cavendish Invitational will be played in Monte Carlo this year. I hope to get agreements to have a European and a world championships there.

I have the full support of the Société des Bains de Mer – this is not the case with casinos in Las Vegas - and had the pleasure and honor to discuss some details in private with Prince Albert. This proves to me that I am working in the right direction.

DB

You showed recently your support to IMSA. Can you explain?

PZ

I like the concept. I won a chess title in university in Switzerland in my early age, and I play some Go without much success, but first my support goes to José Damiani, who has done so much for the development of bridge

DB

How much of your time and money do you invest in bridge?

PZ

I play bridge 90 days per year. How much it costs me I will not tell you but certainly less than people usually think. Money is now for me a means, not an aim. There is a real pleasure to give!

DB

Finally, do you wish to add anything ?

PZ

Yes I wish the European Bridge League to become professional with stronger structure and organizing several European events every year, as the ACBL does in North America. There would be more sponsors if they get the chance to play more tournaments and win more titles.

DB

Did we just interview the next EBL President?

PZ

Certainly not, but if a small side chair is available...
